Foreign Nationals who do not have a valid visa, have to obtain a landing permit / visa from the Department of Immigration & Emigration prior to their departure.

	Valid resident visa holders are allowed to undergo home quarantine if facilities are available at home.
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B Approval to Quarantine at a Residence for Foreign national staff members of the diplomatic missions or UN organizations / UN Specialized agencies / International Organizations with permanent offices in Sri Lanka (mentioned in Annex 01) who are holding Diplomatic / UN / Official passports

B.1	Foreign National Staff members and their accompanying spouse, parents and children are allowed to undergo mandatory Quarantine at a Quarantine Hotel / Safe & Secure Certified Level 1 Hotel / Quarantine at an area Medical Officer of Health (MOH) approved residence.
B.2	If Foreign National staff members of Diplomatic Missions or Foreign National staff members of organizations/agencies are undergoing mandatory quarantine at a residence, respective Diplomatic Mission / Organization / Agency with permanent offices in Sri Lanka should take prior approval in writing from area MOH mentioning that the residence is suitable for mandatory quarantine.
B.3	Details of the Foreign National Staff members and their accompanying spouse, parents and children undergoing mandatory quarantine at approved residences should be informed to area MOH on Day 1 of arrival, as they have to quarantine under the supervision of area MOH.

C Pre departure negative COVID-19 PCR test report

C.1	Travellers of two years and above arriving in Sri Lanka should mandatorily carry a negative COVID-19 PCR test report in English language done within 72 hours prior to embarkation
C.2	Travellers with a history of COVID-19 infection during past six months and only with a single dose of vaccine taken after two weeks of recovery and their unvaccinated children below 18 years could arrive with a negative COVID-19 PCR Report done within 72 hours of embarkation . If they have a history of infection within last three months, instead of a PCR test, they could arrive with a negative COVID-19 Rapid Antigen Test report done within 48 hours prior to embarkation. They should carry a diagnosis card or verifiable evidence or positive PCR report or positive Rapid Antigen Test report as a proof of past history of illness (in English).

D COVID-19 Vaccination Certificate/Card

D.1	Travellers who have received the recommended doses of COVID-19 vaccine should carry the original vaccination certificate / card (together with a certified copy of English language translation if the certificate/card is not in English or if relevant data are not indicated in English in a non - English certificate / card) or verifiable evidence of vaccination.
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E “Fully Vaccinated” travellers

E.1	If the recommended doses of the COVID-19 vaccination are completed and departs from abroad two weeks after completion of vaccination , they will be considered as “Fully Vaccinated” .
E.2	As there are positive cases reported among fully vaccinated persons in Sri Lanka and in other countries, it is important to minimize the spread of COVID-19 or its variants entering in to the country. Therefore, all travellers including fully vaccinated travellers should not relax the preventive measures and should abide by the COVID-19 preventive measures imposed by the Government of Sri Lanka.

F Procedures to follow at the arriving airport in Sri Lanka

F.1	Each traveller should submit a completed Health Declaration Form to the staff of the Airport Health Office at the health counters of arriving airport. Separate Health Declaration Form should be submitted for each of accompanying children if any.
F.2	Travellers who have completed the recommended doses of the COVID-19 vaccination and departs from abroad after two weeks of completion of vaccination , should produce the vaccination certificate / card / verifiable evidence (in English) to Airport Health Officer at arriving airport.
F.3	After completion of formalities at the airport, travellers who are required to be quarantined will be transferred to a Quarantine Centre / Quarantine Hotel managed by the Government of Sri Lanka or to a Safe & Secure Certified Level 1 Hotel. Transport shall be provided by the government authorities or the Hotel Management on a pre-determined manner. Respective Diplomatic Mission / Organization / Agency with permanent offices in Sri Lanka should arrange their own transport (adhering to preventive measures imposed by Government of Sri Lanka) to transport Foreign National staff members, if undergoing quarantine at an area Medical Officer of Health (MOH) approved residence.

G. Procedures to be followed after released from the arriving airport

G.1	Fully vaccinated travellers	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Fully vaccinated travellers who have completed 14 days after recommended doses of vaccination and arriving with a negative COVID-19 PCR Report done within 72 hours of embarkation / negative COVID-19 Rapid Antigen Test report done within 48 hours prior to embarkation (as mentioned in Section C) will be released from airport and do not need to do Day 1 PCR test or undergo quarantine after arriving in Sri Lanka. If develop COVID-19 like symptoms, they should conduct a COVID-19 test from a Ministry of Health approved laboratory and produce the report to area Medical Officer of Health (MOH).
G.2	Unvaccinated children below 18 years old of fully vaccinated parents	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Children below 12 years do not need to do COVID-19 testing after arriving in Sri Lanka Unvaccinated children below 12 years of fully vaccinated parents who are Sri Lankan citizens / Dual citizens / Resident visa holders should be allowed to travel home with parents. Unvaccinated children of 12 -18 years of fully vaccinated parents need to undergo Day 1 PCR testing at a Ministry of Health approved laboratory at Katunayake or at a Government Quarantine Centre (for Sri Lankans and Dual Citizens) / Quarantine Hotel / Safe & Secure Certified Level 1 Hotel. If the Day 1 PCR report is negative, they can be released from Quarantine and should be allowed to go home with fully vaccinated parents. They will not be further quarantined. Unvaccinated children below 12 years of fully vaccinated parents who are Tourists / Foreign Nationals should be allowed to travel with fully vaccinated parents. Unvaccinated children of 12 -18 years of fully vaccinated parents who are Tourists / Foreign nationals need to undergo Day 1 PCR testing at a Ministry of Health approved laboratory at Katunayake / Quarantine Hotel / Safe & Secure Certified Level 1 Hotel. If the Day 1 PCR report is negative, they can be released from Quarantine and should be allowed to go home / hotel with fully vaccinated parents. They will not be further quarantined.

H.1	Foreign National Seafarers or Sea marshals who are NOT Fully vaccinated arriving in Sri Lanka via airport/seaports	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • They may be arriving into the country via airports/ seaports to board a ship or to travel to another country via airport. If not received COVID-19 vaccination / not completed the recommended doses of vaccination / arrive in less than 14 days of recommended doses of vaccination, they should be quarantined in an Isolation Centre (used to quarantine seafarers / sea marshals) until completion of 7 Days. • If arriving via airports, they have to arrive with predeparture COVID-19 test reports as stipulated in Section C of this guideline.

		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Seafarers or Sea marshals arriving via airports and seaports should undergo Day 1 PCR test. • They can be released from quarantine by conducting Exit COVID-19 PCR test/ Rapid Antigen Test on Day 7 and producing the negative PCR/ Rapid Antigen Test result. • Seafarers/Sea marshals can be released from the isolation center to directly travel to the airport/seaport to board a ship or to travel to another country via airport during the period of quarantine.

If the Day 1 PCR report is negative, can undergo home quarantine, if facilities are available at home. • Should perform Exit COVID-19 PCR test / Rapid Antigen Test on Day 7 and can be released from quarantine on Day 7 by producing the negative test result to the area MOH.
H.3	Fully vaccinated Sri Lankan / Foreign National Seafarers / Sea marshals arriving via airports	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Fully vaccinated seafarers/ sea marshals who have completed 14 days after recommended doses of vaccination and arriving with a negative COVID-19 PCR report done within 72 hours of embarkation / negative COVID-19 Rapid Antigen Test report done within 48 hours prior to embarkation (as mentioned in Section C) will be released and do not need to undergo quarantine after arriving in Sri Lanka. • If COVID-19 pre boarding PCR is exempted for Sri Lankan Seafarers / sea marshals as per the instructions of the letter of DGHS, No. DQ/06/2020, Dated 2021/03/08, should perform Day 1 PCR at a Ministry of Health approved laboratory at Katunayake or at a Government Quarantine Centre / Quarantine Hotel/ Safe & Secure Certified Level 1 Hotel. They can be released with a negative PCR report and do not need to undergo quarantine. • If develop COVID-19 like symptoms, should conduct a PCR test from a Ministry of Health approved laboratory and produce to area Medical Officer of Health (MOH).
H.4	Fully vaccinated Sri Lankan / Foreign National Seafarers / Sea marshals arriving via seaports	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Fully vaccinated seafarers/ sea marshals who have completed 14 days after recommended doses of vaccination should undergo Day 1 PCR testing at an Isolation Centre (Quarantine Centre for seafarers / sea marshals). They can be released with a negative PCR report and do not need to undergo quarantine.

All other Seafarer / Sea marshal operations including quarantine measures for Seafarers / Sea marshals **arriving via seaports** should be done adhering to the provisions in Standard Operating Procedures issued by the Ministry of Health.

I Travellers with Positive COVID-19 test reports

I.1	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • In charge officer of the Quarantine Hotel / Quarantine Centre or Hotel Doctor / Hotel Management at Safe & Secure Certified Level 1 Hotel / Isolation Centre (Quarantine facility for seafarers/ sea marshals)/ local Shipping Agents should immediately inform the details of the COVID-19 test positive person to the area Medical officer of Health (MOH) and email the details to Epidemiology Unit (chepid@slt.net.lk and samithag@hotmail.com).
I.2	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All Ministry of Health approved laboratories (Private and State sector) conducting COVID-19 tests, should inform the Positive test results with the details of the positive person immediately to Epidemiology Unit (chepid@slt.net.lk and samithag@hotmail.com) and area MOH.

I.3	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Sri Lankan Citizens (including Sri Lankan Seafarers / Sea marshals), Dual Citizens can be allowed to isolate at home or at an Intermediate Care Centre / designated hospital. Resident Visa Holders can be allowed to isolate at home or at an Intermediate Care Centre managed by Private Hospital / designated Private Hospital. Foreign National staff members of the diplomatic missions or UN Organizations / UN Specialized agencies / International Organizations with permanent offices in Sri Lanka, can be allowed to isolate at residence or at an Intermediate Care Centre managed by private hospital/ designated private hospital. All other Foreign Nationals will be sent to an Intermediate Care center managed by private hospital/ designated private hospital.
I.4	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> With the positive results, if Sri Lankan Citizens / Dual Citizens / Resident visa holders / released to isolate at home (Home Isolation), they should be transported to their homes by adhering to health measures. Travellers should contact (email / phone) the area Medical Officer of Health, once they arrive at home. They should be registered at home care management system in Sri Lanka by informing the area MOH. If released for Home Isolation, they should stay at home / residence without leaving the premises and practice all health measures to prevent other family members at home / residence getting infected. They have to follow the guidelines issued by Ministry of Health on Home Care Management for positive persons.

J Other Measures

J.1	In charge officer of the Quarantine Hotel / Quarantine Centre or Hotel Doctor at Safe & Secure Certified Level 1 Hotel / the staff of Airport Health Office should verify the status of vaccination of the traveller.
J.2	In charge officer of the Quarantine Hotel / Quarantine Centre or Hotel Doctor at Safe & Secure Certified Level 1 Hotel should issue a "Discharge Document" when discharging travellers who are undergoing quarantine.
J.3	If the Day 1 PCR test report is negative, Tourists arriving via Sri Lanka Tourism are allowed to move between Safe & Secure Certified Level 1 Hotels in a bio-secure travel bubble and allowed to visit approved important sites in a bio-secure travel bubble during the quarantine period.
J.4	PCR testing of the travellers after arriving in Sri Lanka should be conducted by a Ministry of Health approved laboratory (Private sector or State sector). List of approved Private Sector Laboratories is available at Ministry of Health Website (http://www.health.gov.lk/moh_final/english/news_read_more.php?id=999)
J.5	If a COVID-19 test result of an accompanying traveller of the child is positive, exempted children will also be subjected to PCR testing subsequently.
J.6	Quarantine period of travellers will be extended, if they are identified as immediate close contacts of a COVID-19 positive person or if they arrive from high-risk countries as decided by health authorities.
J.7	Travellers who are under mandatory quarantine at a Quarantine Hotel/ Centre/ Safe & Secure Certified Level 1 Hotel/ Home / approved quarantine residence are allowed to travel to foreign countries during the quarantine period with negative COVID-19 PCR reports.
J.8	All COVID-19 PCR / Rapid Antigen test results of the travellers should be informed to area Medical Officer of Health. List of contact details of area Medical Officer of Health (MOH) is available at Ministry of Health Website (http://www.health.gov.lk/moh_final/english/news_read_more.php?id=999)

Summary on quarantine measures for travellers arriving in Sri Lanka is shown in Annex 02.

Summary on isolation for travellers who are tested positive is shown in Annex 03.

This guideline is effective for the travellers arriving in Sri Lanka from 00:00 on 26th of October 2021 and for the travellers who have already arrived in Sri Lanka.

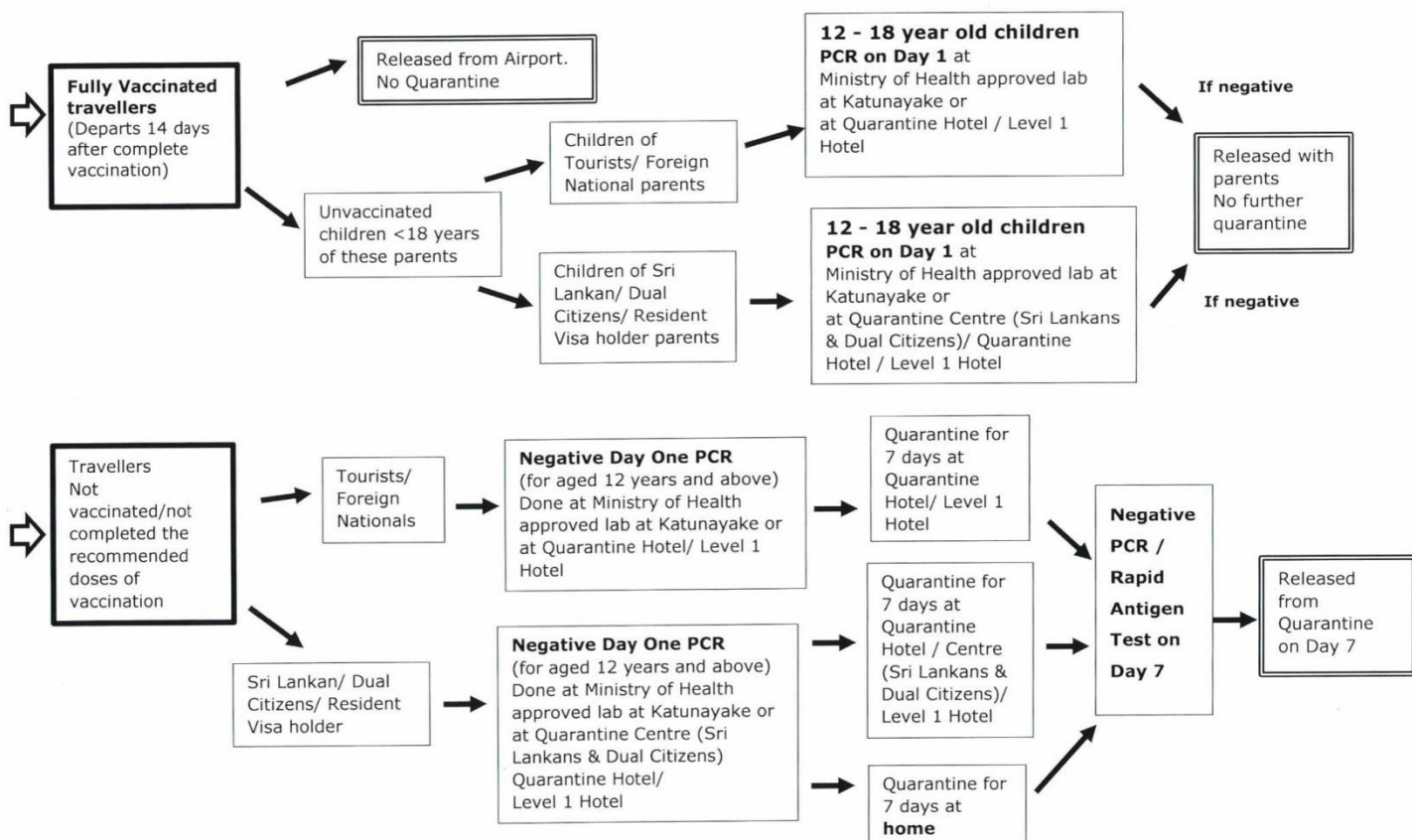
This guideline will be revised depending on the COVID-19 situation in the country and the global situation.

Completing the formalities and verifying the documents at the airport

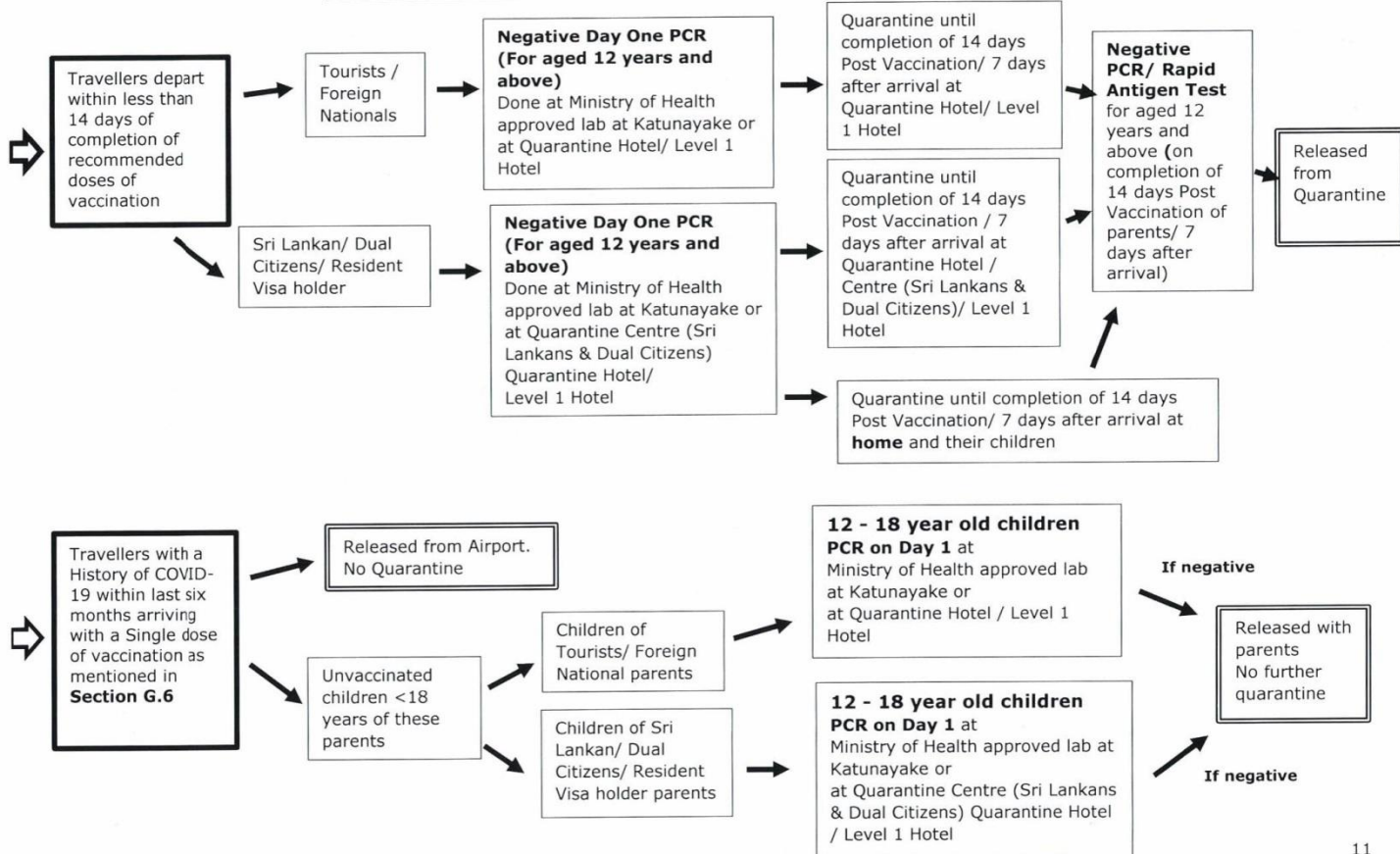


Travellers arriving in Sri Lanka
