



An island of national parks, venerated temples, tea plantations and rose-gold beaches: Sri Lanka packs in plenty of experiences. The Cultural Triangle is Sri Lanka's historic heartland, a concentration of extravagant ancient cities, life in the most endearing ways, waves that takes the hot sunny beaches a notch up, hikes that takes you to pretty views. From here you can head into the cooler climes of the central highlands, where neatly tended tea estates sit between colonial cottages and swathes of forest. The hills drop sharply down to the national parks and rainforest below, which shelter elephants, sloth bears and, more elusively, leopards. Along the coast you find the Dutch fortress of Galle and palm-fringed coves.

This tour covers some of Sri Lanka's popular attractions available to visit at the time of travel and at the same time offers you space to relax and have your own time while you enjoy your Sri Lanka tour. Itinerary

Day 1: AIRPORT | NEGOMBO [Approx. travel time 20 min]

On arrival meet your Tripavi representative who will introduce you to your private chauffeur-guide. Your chauffeur-guide will stay with you for the duration of your trip. Your Sri Lankan experience begins with a journey to Negombo. Depending on the time of your flight, you will have the rest of the day at your own leisure.



Day 2: NEGOMBO | ELEPHANT FOUNDATION | SIGIRIYA [Approx. travel time 2 hrs to Kegalle | Kegalle to Sigiriya 2 ½ hrs without stops]

After breakfast leave to Sigiriya, en-route visit to Millennium Elephant Foundation, an organization and charity set up to rescue and care for captive Asian elephants in Sri Lanka. The foundation is situated on a 15-acre estate by the name of Samaragiri, which is located 10 km northwest of Kegalle. Bareback elephant riding is offered to visitors, although never with a howdah – the traditional carriage most often seen in historic photographs. And in recognition of changing times, the MEF also promotes an elephant walk experience as an alternative to riding. Unlike the bareback riding, elephants can move at their leisure while visitors just troll alongside in awe. As well as the walk, you can also listen to an educational talk, help bathe an elephant in the river, even have an optional elephant shower and tour an elephant dung factory, this 2-to-3-hour experience should not go missing on your Sri Lanka journey.





Sri Lanka's famous Cultural Triangle offers plenty to fire both mind and body over the next three days, the journey from Kegalle will take 2.5 hours. The lion rock of Mount Sigiriya, and Dambulla's Buddhist Cave Temple & cultural ruins, these UNESCO world heritage sites are included in your holiday. Explore these cultural sites at your own pace planning your day with our expert chauffeur drivers.

Day 3: SIGIRIYA | POLONNARUWA | SIGIRIYA [Approx. travel time 1.5 hrs to Polonnaruwa]

This day early morning you will take a trip to Polonnaruwa ancient city. Polonnaruwa city in ruins is the second kingdom of Sri Lanka. very well preserved Polonnaruwa city is a cross section of what the Sri Lankan history and archeology had been. In Polonnaruwa you will see temples, image houses, palaces and impressive buddha statues that relates to the Polonnaruwa era and shows distintive differences from what other eras are bringing forth. Later in the day before stopping for lunch at a traditional Sri Lankan spread offering resaurant set up in the most magical backdrop of a functioning paddy field, you will learn how the paddy crop becomes the rice and sets in your



plate. You will learn this by visiting a working rice mill and seeing the process by yourself. Lunch today is a traditional rice and curry spread which is enjoyed at a very humble traditional setting. After lunch we take a safari to either Minneriya/ Kaudulla or Eco Park national parks and on a 4x4 drive you will do a game drive across the national park and may stumble upon great herds of elephants, freely roaming along within the park apart from deer and birds and an occasional sloth bear.

Day 4: SIGIRIYA

After early breakfast, you will take a visit to the Sigiriya Rock fortress. The 5th century rock fortress of King Kashyapa is known around the world for its amazing architecture, landscaped gardens, the mirror wall, and the well detailed fresco art. Sigiriya is a real hideout fortress for the king with two moats, inner and outer, along the years it has converted from a fortress to a hermitage and the waves of time and stories of ages still very visible among the timeline.

The afternoon is for you to look back at the living of Sri Lankan Buddhists in two different angles. We would recommend a visit to a nearby Buddhist temple and offer the monks alms. The Buddhist monks do not cook for themselves and the only means of them surviving is through the alms devotees prepare for them. Therefore offering alms to Buddhist monks are considered a good. You can also have discussion about anything that you want to get clarified on Buddhism and on the Sri Lankan culture along with huge Buddhist influence in shaping such culture.



Later in the afternoon you have the option of exploring some nice nature walks or take a cycle ride to explore the villages and cultivations in Dambulla or Sigiriya.



Day 4: DAMBULLA | KANDY [Approx. travel time 2.5 hrs to Kandy without stops]

After breakfast, heading to Kandy. Before Kandy we stop for Dambulla cave Temple & one of the many spice plantations, where we get a glimpse into effect on the body and plant magic and knowledge of how they are used as a spice and creams. Kandy region is Sri Lanka's heart and is situated in a valley surrounded by mountains. It was the last kingdom of Sri Lanka.

Dambulla cave temple has added value in large to the king's work. The temple is also called Ran Giri Dambulu Viharaya giving the meaning of 'Golden rock temple'. The major attractions here are the 5 separate caves – Devaraja



Viharaya, Maharaja Viharaya, Maha Alut Viharaya, Pashchima Viharaya and Devana Alut Viharaya containing not less than 150 Buddha images & statues.

Kandy is the last monarch city in Sri Lanka and a town with its modern parts mixing together with the colonial parts. Kandy is also the house of popular Temple of tooth which parades the perahera each year which is a spectacle in its own charm.





Day 5: KANDY

Today morning after breakfast you will take drive to Peradeniya Botanical Gardens. Peradeniya is famous for its magnificent botanic gardens which were conceived originally as Queen's pleasure garden. It was converted to a 60ha botanical garden in 1821 and contains well-kept lawns, an orchid house with an extensive/ rare collection, octagon conservatory, fernery, banks of bamboo and various floras inclusive of canas, hibiscus, chrysanthemums, croton and bougainvillea. Avenue of palms, and colorful lawn are not amiss. The palm avenue meets the river drive at the end of it which has a suspension bridge across the river which now is being rarely used. After the garden tour we extend travels to an art center in Kandy headed by a



professor at one of the most prestigious Sri Lankan universities. This art center is a treasure in itself. The building is a 16th century building housing arts and antiques from all the eras and pre eras the house has lived through. There will be lunch served and you can direct the questions over lunch to the professor. After the interesting tour you will take time to go visit the Temple of tooth in Kandy. Temple of tooth is the famous temple housing Lord Buddha's left tooth relic and is a popular place of worship among the Buddhists and is considered the highest most sacred place among Buddhist temples in Sri Lanka. Temple also holds the famous annual Perahera parade, an annual cultural parade known for the traditional colorful cultural shows and elephant which carries the tooth relic. This is closely associated with the belief that it brings rain to the country apart from being a colorful event.

Day 6: KANDY | WELIGAMA [BY AIR 40 min + 1 hrs land transport]



Today morning after breakfast, you will be escorted to take your seaplane ride to the southern part of the country to Weligama. From Polgolla dam the seaplane charter will land in the Koggala Lake. There on, you can utilize the time to take a stroll across the Galle Dutch Fort. Galle is the most important town in the south and its fort area, with its mighty ramparts, encloses some wonderful living collections of colonial architecture. A laid back and enchanting place to wander, it was declared a UNESCO world heritage site in 1988. Rather removed from the busy modern town, the fort remains a village atmosphere. You will take a guided walk around this city of time and your host will tell you very interesting stories from the gone days. Stories of how

the names came to being, how the streets were inhibited and all. With the Portuguese style low roofed pillared buildings like in a movie set shading your way, Fort also boasts its own food culture. Maybe an ice cream to beat the heat from all the walking is a perfect idea. Fort also has a good collection of museums showcasing artifacts from the past. Every cobblestone here tells a story and if you are lucky you will be able to catch the fort jumpers. These enthusiastic sea jumpers, diving off straight to the sea depth from the fort wall and are a prominent sight in the Fort. After an enthusiastic fort walk, you will be directed to your seaside adobe in Weligama. If you choose to hit the road instead of the sea plane transfer you could experience a visit at a spice garden on route as well as local tea factory on your 5.5 hrs journey heading south from the hills.



Day 7: WELIGAMA

This day as the morning falls you will start off a wonderful beach vacation from your all-equipped luxury beach hotel. as lazing out in the sun is highly advised, the morning is kept free for you to do just that. For lunch we visit the beautiful boutique hotel Kahanda Kanda, where you will be served an exquisite spread of Sri Lankan delicacy in rice and curry, the Sri Lankan staple. After the quite colorful lunch we will head over to the Handungoda tea estate, to witness how white tea is being made. White tea is considered to be the world's purest tea and the estate grows and processes the tips as along with a growth of variety of spices that you can get your eyes on. While all this is so worthwhile, you can also choose to be just in the sun or at the resort, maybe experiencing a spa day for the ultimate relaxation.

Day 9: WELIGAMA | LUNUGANGA BENTOTA | COLOMBO [Approx. Travel time 2 hrs to Bentota | Bentota to Colombo 1.5 hrs]

Checking out from the beach adobe today, we take a slow drive to Bentota where you will visit Lunuganga, the Garden house of Sri Lanka's most celebrated and one of Asia's most influential architects of his time, Geoffrey Bawa. His garden is a treasure trove in each corner you look, from the architecture, to monuments to even the growth of trees is simply art at Lunuganga. This garden immerses you and after the garden tour we will head to Colombo. On our way to the Colombo hotel, a pit stop to admire one of Bawa's greatest works, the parliament is always preferred. Arriving in Colombo the commercial epicentre of the country, you will be checked into your hotel. Colombo is a city with an old soul living in the modern times, as spoken by Dutch inspired buildings, cobblestone lanes along shoulder with high rising sky scrapers. It's a place where contradicting cultures make peace. Today is the last day of your vacation and city of Colombo will make it even more memorable for you to stay.





Day 10: DEPARTURE [Approx. Travel time 1 hrs to Airport]

Catch the flight at the Bandaranaike International Airport to head home.
